











International Conference on Governance, Sustainability and Resilience in a Post-Covid Period (23-25 January 2023)

The School of Governance and Society (SGS), at the University of Management and Technology (UMT), organized a three-day International Hybrid Conference on Governance, Sustainability, and Resilience in the Post-Covid Period (ICGSR, 2023) from 23 - 25 January 2023. The conference was organized from the Sustainable Water Resources Initiative Platform (SWRI), created by Dr. Seemi Waheed in 2022 for carrying out research, organizing talks, discussions, conferences to name a few. The Second International Conference on Governance, Sustainability and Resilience in Post-Covid Period was organized from the same platform. This conference aimed to bring diverse stakeholders and share thoughts for understanding the new normal challenges. We are thankful to our knowledge partners for their indelible support. The knowledge partners included College of Earth, and Environment Studies (CEES), University of the Punjab, HEC, UNICEF and SWRI. Inaugural opening day 1: The conference was opened by Mr. Kamran Naeem, National UNICEF Chief on Climate Change and WASH. The chair Dr. Aisha Azhar presented overview of the conference, welcomed and thanked guest speakers, paper presenters, conference partners and attendees of conference. This was followed by the presentation of conference convener Dr. Seemi Waheed who gave the detail of conference themes and summary of main keynote talks and panel discussions. The inaugural keynote speaker, Prof. Dr. Saleemul Huq (OBE) Director of the International Centre for Climate Change and Development (ICCCAD), Bangladesh, and top ten 'Nature' scientist, spoke on loss and damage and creation of Loss and Damage Fund in COP 27.
